



Statement of Intent – Art & Design

Purpose – Why is this subject important?

- Creativity encourages freedom, self-expression and instils independence, confidence and individual identity.
- It allows personal development, fostering an enhanced wellbeing and supporting mindfulness and strong mental health.
- Art & Design develops a wide range of key skills including problem solving, language and communication, social, decision taking, critical thinking & risk taking.
