Pupils will continue to receive weekly spellings to learn at home. Each week there will be a new spelling pattern to learn which we continue to practice as part of our spelling work in school. It will greatly benefit your child if they can practice their spellings for a few minutes each night to help them become spelling experts!

A weekly homework task will continue to be given on a Friday to be returned by the following Wednesday. All of the tasks relate to the learning taking place in school.

### **Y3 BEDROCK LEARNING:**

We encourage our Year 3 pupils to complete two Bedrock tasks each week. I was very impressed with the learning pupils completed last term. Keep going Year 3!

## **Curriculum Learning**

In English this half-term we will be focusing on two new units of work: Poetry and Legend stories. Within this work we will be developing our performance skills, improving our grammar knowledge, reading a variety of texts and improving our writing skills.

In Maths, this half-term we will continue to develop our addition and subtraction skills extending on our skills from last term and become confident in multiplying and dividing, improving our knowledge of our times tables.

In other areas of learning this half-term, we will become historians learning about Significant People from the past, focusing on Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell. For all our budding artists we will be focusing on Still-life drawing in our Art and Design Unit.
