In Maths, we will continue to develop our multiplication and division skills extending on our learning from last term and becoming more confident in multiplying and dividing. We will also be learning about 'Statistics' and 'Shapes' later on in the term.

In other areas of learning, we will be focusing on our Geography skills in our unit of work called 'Coast to Coast' within this topic we will be learning about coastal towns in our country, comparing two different places and learning about coastal erosion. The children have already shown a great interest in this topic!
