Performance Opportunity at St Edmundsbury Cathedral - Noye's Fludde

I am delighted to announce that our current Year 4/5 pupils will be working alongside other schools with Bury Cathedral music team to perform an opera for children and adults by Suffolk-born composer Benjamin Britten. This incredible piece of music tells the story of Noah's Ark and features roles for children singers, many of whom play the roles of animals. The dates of the performances are Friday 15th and Saturday 16th November at the Cathedral. Singing workshops will commence at school from May, so that we are familiar with the music by the summer holiday, and from September work will commence on the production side. We are thrilled to be involved with this exciting project in conjunction with Arts Council England.
